Come, Holy Spirit

Recently, I was delighted to host, in my garden, the first in-person meeting of the Community of St Aldhelm for over a year. It was wonderful to be together, and we spent some time reflecting on Jesus' teaching on the gift of the Holy Spirit as we read about it in John 15: 15-21, using materials prepared for a Rudford Retreat at Home by the Revd Catherine Williams. In this blog, I share these materials with the wider church family in case you would like to use them. *Begin by reading John 15:15-21, and then take time to reflect on some of the questions below:*

- The setting for the passage is the in-between time after Ascension and before Pentecost. We are living in an 'in-between time' at present as we begin to emerge slowly from lockdown. How does this 'in-between time' feel for you? What are you waiting for at this time and what will it be like when the waiting is over? What do you long to do in the future? Tell God about that now.
- 2. Jesus suggests that the disciples will know the Spirit of truth because the Spirit will remain with them and live in them. In what ways do you know the Spirit of truth in your life? What does it feel like when you know something to be false or lacking in truth? Think of a situation in our world today where truth is lacking. Pray for the Holy Spirit to bring truth to that situation.
- 3. Jesus tells his disciples that he will be with them, even when they can no longer see him. Imagine Jesus sitting beside you. What do you want to say to him? Say it now. How does Jesus respond to you? What do you do next?
- 4. Jesus promised his followers the gift of the Holy Spirit. Close your eyes and imagine what it would have been like to have been there at Pentecost on that first outpouring of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2). What difference does the gift of the Spirit make in your life? Are there any gifts that you might want to ask for in prayer? Do that now.

I pray that God will bless you as you reflect on these Scripture and pray 'Come, Holy Spirit'.

Corinthians: 4-13:5:1

¹³ It is written: 'I believed; therefore I have spoken.'^[a] Since we have that same spirit of^[b] faith, we also believe and therefore speak, ¹⁴ because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus from the dead will also raise us with Jesus and present us with you to himself. ¹⁵ All this is for your benefit, so that the grace that is reaching more and more people may cause thanksgiving to overflow to the glory of God.

¹⁶ Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. ¹⁷ For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. ¹⁸ So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal.

Awaiting the new body

5 For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal house in heaven, not built by human hands.

Mark 3: 20-34

²⁰ Then Jesus entered a house, and again a crowd gathered, so that he and his disciples were not even able to eat. ²¹ When his family^[a] heard about this, they went to take charge of him, for they said, 'He is out of his mind.' ²² And the teachers of the law who came down from Jerusalem said, 'He is possessed by Beelzebul! By the prince of demons he is driving out demons.'

²³ So Jesus called them over to him and began to speak to them in parables: 'How can Satan drive out Satan? ²⁴ If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. ²⁵ If a house is divided against itself, that house cannot stand. ²⁶ And if Satan opposes himself and is divided, he cannot stand; his end has come. ²⁷ In fact, no one can enter a strong man's house without first tying him up. Then he can plunder the strong man's house. ²⁸ Truly I tell you, people can be forgiven all their sins and every slander they utter, ²⁹ but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will never be forgiven; they are guilty of an eternal sin.' ³⁰ He said this because they were saying, 'He has an impure spirit.' ³¹ Then Jesus' mother and brothers arrived. Standing outside, they sent someone in to call him. ³² A crowd was sitting round him, and they told him, 'Your mother and brothers are outside looking for you.' ³³ 'Who are my mother and my brothers?' he asked.³⁴ Then he looked at those seated in a circle round him and said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers!

Discipleship Questions

- Read Mark 3:22-27. In these verses we see Jesus facing criticism from religious people. They didn't deny that he had performed exorcisms, but they questioned that what he was doing came from God. Jesus shows them why, logically, they should believe that God's power is at work. Do we sometimes find it hard to discern whether something – miraculous or otherwise – is from God? Can you think of any examples from your personal experience? What test did you apply, and what conclusion do you come to?
- 2. Read verses 28-30. Down the ages, many people have become worried about what Jesus meant when he talked about an unforgivable sin against the Holy Spirit. How might we deduce from the context of this passage what Jesus was referring to?
- 3. Read verse 21-22 and 31-35. Jesus' friends seem to have been worried that he was over-reaching himself, and wanted to rein him in, and some scholars think that his family might have felt the same way. Have you been in situations where you have wanted to do more for God, or perhaps live out your faith in a different way, but felt inhibited because of family pressure? If this is a current issue, you might like to ask someone to pray with you about it.
- 4. Jesus' words emphasise that when we become Christians we gain a whole new family on the company of other believers. When have you felt this most strongly? How can we reinforce this sense of being 'the family of God' in our church life'?
